

4/20/24 DRIVING TOUR OF BERKELEY NORTH HISTORIC TREASURES

Visit St. Stephen Library, St. Stephen's Episcopal Church and Cemetery, Pineville Chapel, and the Maude Callen Clinic with Lunch.

Limited to 25 and requires registration with \$10 pre-paid lunch.

- **9:30** Meet up at *Site 1 St. Stephen Library* at 1104 S. Main Street, St. Stephen, SC. At 10 learn about the historic former St. Stephen Elementary School built in the 1930's Betty Shealy, Berkeley County Historical Society.
- **10:30** Travel to *Site 2 St. Stephen's Episcopal Church*, located at 196 Brick Church Circle, St. Stephen, SC and built in the 1760s, one of a handful of surviving 18th-century brick parish churches in the state, with a number of architectural features not found on any other of the period. It was declared a National Historic Landmark in 1970. Shanda Phillips, Vestry of St. Stephen Episcopal; Berkeley 250 Board Member.
- 11:30 Boxed lunches and drinks at St. Stephen's Parish House (building to the left of the church).
- **12:15** Head out to *Site 3 Pineville Chapel*, Planned in 1794, built in 1810, and placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1992 as part of the Pineville Historic District Keith Gourdin, Berkeley 250 Historian
- 1:15 Drive to the *Site 4 Maude Callen Clinic* at 2669 Highway 45, Pineville, SC and learn about the "Angel in Twilight", nurse-midwife Maude Callen. Libba Carroll, Friends of Maude Callen.
- **2:00** Leave for home.
- **4/21/24** Pineville Chapel is open for its once-a-year church service. Visitors are welcome! Church begins at 10:30 with covered dish meal on the grounds. Bring your lunch and a chair.
